

VIDEO GAMING CONDITIONS

Video Gaming Terminal (VGT): is an electronic video game machine that, upon insertion of cash, electronic card or voucher or any combination thereof, is available to play or simulate the play of a video game, including but not limited to video poker, line up, and blackjack, utilizing a video display and microprocessors in which the player may receive free games or credits that can be redeemed for cash. The term does not include a machine that directly dispenses coins, cash, or tokens or is for amusement purposes only.

No establishment shall install a VGT without having first obtained a Class V Video Gaming supplemental liquor license from the Village. The creation of a Class V supplemental liquor license, and issuance by the Liquor Commissioner, is subject to approval by the Village Board, in accordance with the following conditions:

- The establishment must be authorized to operate VGTs by a license issued by the State of Illinois Gaming Board pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 et seq. - The licensee of the establishment must be in good-standing with the Village, with a Village Class "D-2" Dining (Full Liquor), "H" Hotel or "R" Resort liquor license.
- Up to six (6) VGTs may be installed at each licensed premises, provided they are all situated in an area restricted to patrons 21 years of age or older; and under the direct and constant supervision of a BASSET certified employee who is also 21 years of age or older.
- All VGTs must be screened from view by patrons who are less than 21 years of age.
- The service of alcoholic beverages and video gaming must be an ancillary and incidental use.
- Payment of the annual supplemental liquor license fee of \$500.00 per VGT.

Once issued, the licensed establishment:

- Shall comply with all provisions of the Bloomingdale Village Code and the Illinois Video Gaming Act, and all rules, regulations and restrictions imposed by the Illinois Gaming Board.
- Shall permit inspection of any licensed premises during regular business hours by village officials to determine compliance with the provisions of this code.
- Is subject to suspension or revocation of the supplemental license, as well as fines and appeals, in accordance with Section 4-2-27 of the Village Code. If the supplemental license is revoked or suspended, the Village will consider the video gaming license issued by the Illinois Gaming Board to be revoked or suspended at the same time, and no more VGT activity will be allowed until and up to the time when a license suspension is lifted by the Liquor Commissioner.
