

COVID-19 Related School & Public Facility Closures

Elementary Schools:

Bloomington School District 13: Bloomington School District 13 will continue to engage in remote learning through the end of the school year.

Please continue to check the District 13 website for the most up-to-date information.

Marquart School District 15: Schools will be closed through the end of the 2019-20 school year. Visit www.d15.us/mealsupport for information about emergency food support. Go to www.d15.us/athomelearning for information about At-home Learning.

Community Consolidated School District 93: CCSD93's schools will remain closed, and we will continue to offer teacher-led remote learning opportunities during regularly scheduled school days through the end of the school year. CCSD93 will still offer grab-and-go food pickup opportunities for all students from 10:30 a.m.-noon at all schools and five additional community locations every weekday until further notice. High Schools:

Lake Park High School District 108: All school buildings closed to students. All activities and events at the campuses are cancelled. Students will be "in school" virtually as the District provides continuity of instruction through the remainder of the school year. The following information reflects the dates, times and format for traditional end-of-year events:

- Graduation - Thursday, May 28 (Virtual ceremony)

Glenbard District 87: Remote E-Learning for students will start on Monday March 16 for all Glenbard schools through the remainder of the school year.

Village of Bloomington Facilities:

The Village of Bloomington will reopen Village facilities on Monday, June 1, 2020 for village business that requires in-person transaction. Access to facilities will be restricted and residents are encouraged to use online, and telephone options to perform transactions whenever possible.

With the reopening of facilities, the Village would like to advise patrons what they can expect if doing business at the Village Hall, 201 S. Bloomington Road.

- A face mask or covering will be required to enter the building. Information from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) on face coverings can be found on the CDC [website](#).
- Hand sanitizer will be available at service counters.
- Patrons will be asked to maintain social distancing by remaining 6 feet away from others. Markers on the floor will designate appropriate areas to wait for assistance.

- A limited number of patrons will be allowed to enter a Village facility at one time so that social distancing can be accommodated and crowds are avoided. Please remain patient if you are asked to wait to enter the building.
- Meetings with Village staff will be conducted via appointment only, in order to reserve a meeting room with proper social distancing area. The phone numbers and email addresses for each Department can be found under [Contact Us](#) in the Village website, or by calling general Village number at 630-893-7000.
- Meeting rooms will be reserved for use by village staff. The use of Village meeting rooms by outside community groups and associations will not be permitted until Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan.
- The Village Board will conduct meetings in-person, with a limit of ten (10) total attendees, or electronically. The Plan Commission and all other Village Commissions will continue to meet on an electronic basis. The Village will accept questions or comments from the public as part of the agenda for each Village Board and Commission meeting, which will be audio recorded. Comments and questions for consideration will be accepted by phone, by leaving a voicemail at (630) 671-5611, by email scalerap@vil.bloomingtondale.il.us, or through the "[Report](#)" portal in the Village website, and need to be submitted by no later than 3:00 p.m. on the applicable meeting date.

Although Village facilities will reopen to the public, the Village strongly encourages the public to continue using established “no-contact” methods of conducting Village business such as paying water bills online or using the drive-up drop-box in the front drive of the Village Hall, submitting permit applications and plans online; and emailing business license inquiries, as some examples. Bloomingtondale Golf Club:

Under the Restore Illinois framework in Phase 3, the Bloomingtondale Golf Club is able to play in foursomes and utilize golf carts. Safety guidelines and social distancing will still need to be adhered to. All golfers must follow the specified **changes and guidelines**. Bloomingtondale Library:

Book Drop: All materials can be returned via the outside book drop starting Monday, May 18. If the book drop is full, PLEASE do not leave materials outside the book drop or the building - the book drop will be emptied throughout the day, so please try again at a later time.

Please note that returned materials will remain on your account during a recommended quarantine period of at least 72 hours. Bloomingtondale is a fines free library and there will be no fines assessed on items that become overdue during the quarantine period.

Bloomington Township:

With public health concerns, Bloomington Township services are open by appointment at this time. They have restricted in-person visits, and ask that you please call to make an appointment before coming for Passports, Disabled Parking Placards, Food Pantry, General Assistance, Emergency Assistance, or the Youth Service Bureau. If you need assistance, please call 630.529.7715. The Food Pantry will be offering drive up pickup to minimize personal contact.

All Senior Center activities are either canceled or postponed. MEALS ON WHEELS will still be operating. Staff will be on site to answer phone calls and make appointments for essential services. Please call the Senior Center at (630) 529-7794 for further details and stay tuned for future updates.

Bloomington Park District:

In accordance with the extension of Illinois' stay-at-home order, the Bloomington Park District remains closed through May 30.

These updates are still a work in progress as the District is awaiting Illinois Department of Public Health-approved guidelines.

The following facilities are closed to the public:

- Johnston Recreation Center
- Westfield Gymnasium
- Museum
- Maintenance Building

Additionally, all Bloomington Park District playgrounds, tennis courts, basketball courts, skate park, and athletic fields (baseball, softball, football, soccer) remain closed.

Please consider all sports fields in the community closed to all team sports play and practice until further notice.

Park District walking paths and fishing areas remain open. Limited registration desk staff will be present the following days and times to answer questions and concerns over the phone (NOT in person). Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- The Oasis Water Park will not open for the 2020 summer season.
- The Summer Concert Series is cancelled for the 2020 summer season.
- Summer Day Camp has been restructured to incorporate small group sizes and social/physical distancing restrictions.
- The B-Fit Center and Clubhouse Indoor Playground sponsored by Eagle Falls Dentistry are temporarily closed.
- Rentals and parties are suspended until further notice.
- Open Gym and the Westfield Walking Track are cancelled for the summer (through August 31).
- The Splash & Dash Duathlon is cancelled.
- Exhibitions at the Bloomington Park District Museum are currently cancelled.

Information and updates about closures and restrictions will continue to be communicated on bloomingtonparks.org, via social media and through email.

Other Events:

The Village has been notified of the following community event cancellations:

- **BAA** is cancelling/postponing May programs;
- AARP has announced that all in-person **AARP sponsored Driver Safety Events & Activities** are cancelled until July 1st, 2020, this included the AARP Smart Driver Classroom courses – for Bloomingdale Police Department – Wednesday, June 3rd & Thursday, June 4th, 2020, has been cancelled.;
- The 28th annual Letter Carriers food drive is cancelled, it will resume in 2021;
- **National Night Out** that was originally scheduled for August 4 is cancelled. The National Night Out event next year is currently scheduled for August 3, 2021.
